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WHEN IN SCHOOL

CRITERIA THAT MAY REQUIRE A STUDENT TO BE SEPARATED (ISOLATED) IN SCHOOL (or participating in a school related activity)

The following are examples of criteria that may require the student to be separated:

- A confirmed/probable diagnosis of COVID-19 within the last 14 days and/or without clearance to return to school by a physician or the Public Health Authority.
- A close contact of a confirmed COVID-19 positive individual within the last 14 days and/or without clearance to return to school by a physician or the Public Health Authority.
- Traveled to and spent at least 24 hours, within the last 14 days, in any state listed on CT's COVID-19 Travel Advisory. The state must be on the Advisory list during the time spent in the specific state.
- An elevated body temperature of 100.00 degrees F. confirmed by the school nurse.
- A persistent (constant) cough confirmed by the school nurse.
- Any sign/symptom of respiratory distress (difficulty breathing or shortness of breath) confirmed by the school nurse.
- A loss of taste and/or smell.
- Any other symptom, condition or criteria identified by the school nurse or Public Health Authority requiring separation.

If a school employee, visitor or adult volunteer, while in school or during a school related activity, has any of the above COVID-19 related symptoms or criteria and cannot leave the premises immediately, separation may also be required. This is determined by the school nurse or Public Health Authority.
